



down from heaven and had seen him! Jesus had called his name. Now he knew that Jesus was God's Son. He now believed in Jesus.


Then Saul said, "What wilt thou have me to do?"



Lesson III

A MISSIONARY FOR JESUS

When Saul believed in Jesus he became a Christian. He was very happy. Saul loved Jesus. He was glad he had become a Christian.

A missionary is someone who is sent to preach the story of Jesus. Missionaries go everywhere telling people about Jesus. Sometimes they travel many miles to another country to preach the gospel.

God wanted Saul to be a missionary. He wanted Saul to tell people that Jesus loved them. God wanted him to tell people that Jesus died for their sins. God called Saul to be a missionary for Him.

The church at Antioch sent Saul out

to preach. The church sent Barnabas with Saul. Saul and Barnabas were missionaries for God. They went out to preach to the people about Jesus.

These men travelled many, many miles. Most of the time they walked. Sometimes they travelled by ship. Everywhere they went they talked to the people about God and His Son. They wanted people to believe on Jesus and be saved from their sins.

In one town where Saul preached some of the people grew angry. They did not want to hear about Jesus. These people took up stones and threw them at Saul. They threw stones until they thought he was dead. Then they dragged Saul outside the city and left him there.

Sometimes angry people would have these missionaries put in jail. Sometimes the missionaries were whipped until their backs bled. But this did not stop them from preaching about Jesus.

Everywhere Saul preached about

Jesus, some people listened. And many people believed on Jesus. They trusted Him to forgive their sins. They were happy too. They were happy because their sins were forgiven.

As Saul travelled preaching, his name was changed. People began calling him Paul. In our next lesson we shall call him Paul too.

Paul served God all his life. He made three long journeys. He visited many towns telling about Jesus. Paul was a great missionary.

You can tell people about Jesus. You can invite your friends to go to Sunday school with you. You can be a missionary for Jesus too.




