JAMES PATTEN JOHNSON was born at Winchester, Wayne County, Miss., April 4, 1817. The son of Shade Johnston, and grandson of Jacob Johnston

Jacoh Johnston, mome of three preacher sons of Shade Johnston moved to Butler County, Alabama.

James P. Johnston was one of five sons of Jacob Johnston.

James P. Johnston returned to Mississippi in April (16th), 1839, to Covington County on Leaf River.

Went back to Lauderdale County. Miss. andn drove cattle to Mobile.

The money he saved was lost in the Brandon Bank later.

He returned to Covington County where he marrie Miss Charity Duckworth in 1843. Father 1/2 Children.

They soon afterward moved to Smith County where he was converted, later surrendering to preach, preaching his first sermon in Smith County. He was licensed to preach by Mount Nebo (First) Baptist church now in Bay Springs, in 1850. He was ordained by the same church in 1853. He pastored the church there for some time. He also pastored at Union Baptist Church.

He moved from Smith County to Stonewall, Miss. (Harrison County), in 1879.

Served as missionary for state (General) Assosiation for many years. Worked in Hobolochitto Association. Led in organizing Red Creek Association in 1880. Marca to Marion County Die

Organized Many churches-including Midway in 100 Dec. 20, 1886. Died March 9, 1902. Burried in Union Church cemetery.
