1914 session of Miss. Assoc. at Shiloh church in Wilkinson
County: "The Church of Half-moon Bluff notified the Assoc.
that they had excluded Robert Smith, a preacher, for
un-Christian conduct, giving an account of the case, and
after "due deliberation" the church's action was approved."

Union Assoc. organized ~ 1820
Pearl River Assoc. organized 1820. Half-moon Bluff was one
of 15 churches.

Name of Half-Moon Bluff church was changed to
Hays Creek in 1874. Half-Moon Bluff received
in Mrs. Assn. in 1811. Went into organization of
Pearl River Assn. in 1820. Helped constitute Bigne
Chitto Assn. 1870. into constitution of Magles Creek
Assn. in 1880. church had 38 members - 1880.
Had 43 members in 1890
