Bethel, Choctaw, Leaf River, Yalabusha, Buttahatcha.
State Convention - 1824
State Convention - 1836
Judson Association - 1853
Hobolochitto Association - 1856
General Association - 1855
Mississippi State Association - 1908 - Later renamed
"Mississippi Baptist Association"- still later (1969)
"Baptist Missionary Association of Mississippi."

Presently - 210 or more churches - 12 local Associations.
