 - 2- Calvary Church, Opelousas, Nov. 13, 1812 - 6 charter members
 - 3- Mt. Nebo Church - Jan. 31, 1813 - 6 charter members
 in Pearl River Assn, in 1870
 - 4- Stephens Church, near Clinton. Nov. 29, 1813
 - 5- Buclah Church org. Aug. 27, 1833, 10 charter members.
 Entered Mississippi Assn. in 1833. Eastern Louisiana
 Assn. organized at Buclah in 1842.
 - HBA. 6- Enea Church org. Dec. 31, 1835.
 - 7- Canaan Church org. 1839. West Pearl River Assn
 organized here in 1871.
 - 8- First (white) Baptist of New Orleans org. 1841. This
 Church dissolved. First Baptist (Negro) org. Dec. 28, 1843.
 - HBA 1868 9- Hebron Church in Livingston Parish org. in April, 1835
 7 miles from Denham Springs.
