south of Denham Springs.  
Organized 4<sup>th</sup> Sat. in April,  
1837. Thomas Boyd, first pastor  
and charter member.

Mississippi River Association  
organized Oct. 20, 1843.

First Baptist Church, Jackson.  
Org. 1835.  
First Baptist, Clinton, 1836

Hardy M. Smith born in Bladen County,  
N. C. Nov. 23, 1838.

Moved to Haverock County in 1850  
Profession of faith at Palestine Sept. 24,  
1855?

Baptized Sept. 30, 1855? at Palestine

Was Clerk of Palestine Church from  
Nov. 24, ? to March 25, 1871

(Was dismissed from Palestine by letter  
in 1871?)

Legion to preach Sept. 26, 1874?  
obtained Sept. 13, 1874.

Marrried at Catawba 1863?

Buried at Caesar with masonic  
rites. W. J. Wilbourn brought message  
May 1919.

Jan 1798 Eld. Bailey E. Chaney  
visited the American Settlement  
Near Baton Rouge, La. and preached.  
but ~~was~~ being arrested, he obtained  
release by promising to preach no  
more. after that he returned to Miss. and  
labored thro' until his death, which occurred in 1816.  
Bailey E. Chaney, a pioneer Baptist  
Preacher of Miss.

He was probably the first Baptist preacher  
to preach in Miss. under the American  
Flag.

after previous destruction,  
the church, had apparently been
